

What to Bring

All household members over the age of 18 must be present at time of application intake interview. Each applicant and household member must bring the following:

- Identification
- Proof of citizenship or legal residency
- 6 months of bank statements, savings account, retirement
- Property insurance documents
- FEMA denial or award letter
- Proof of homestead
- 2 months of pay stubs
- 2 years of tax returns
- Receipts for repairs and proof of payment



Thank you for your interest in our programs. Please take note of the following critical program highlights:

- Program funding is subject to approval and availability from Florida Housing Finance Corporation.
- The Disaster Recovery Application Must be complete (with receipts and copies of invoices/ contract) and submitted by November 9, 2017 @5:00 p.m. to Collier County Community and Human Services
- You must income qualify for the assistance (income chart on flip side).
- The property must qualify and be your primary residence in Collier County.
- Mobile/Manufactured Homes built after July 13, 1994 are eligible for rehabilitation assistance.
- You must be a US Citizen or Permanent Resident.
- Approval will occur once your application is completed, please be patient. Approval may take up to 120 days after submission of a completed application.
- If additional documentation is requested and not provided within 72 business hours of the request your application will be denied.

SHIP Disaster Relief Program

In the wake of the devastation the State of Florida has experienced due to recent hurricanes, Collier County Community and Human Services is coordinating the SHIP Disaster Relief Program. The program is a first come, first qualified, income based program available to Collier County residents.



Funding Availability

Disaster Mitigation Strategy: Applicants of owner occupied single family, mobile, or manufactured homes are eligible for up to \$15k in the form of a grant for: **debris removal, emergency repairs, or property damage** that insurance or FEMA is not covering, or to reimburse for your insurance deductible. This is for damages the applicant/owner has or will get repaired.

You must have receipts for expenses incurred prior to November 9, 2017, or the intended repair must have a contract for work by November 9, 2017 and be completed prior to December 31, 2017.

Rehabilitation Strategy: Applicants of owner occupied, single family, multi family, or mobile/manufactured homes (mobile manufactured must be after 7/13/1994) in need of repairs to **correct code violations, health and safety, electrical, plumbing, roofing, HVAC, windows or other structural damage** are eligible for up to \$50k that is not covered by FEMA or insurance. Requires a 15 year, 0% interest rate loan. The work will be completed by a Collier County subrecipient.

Demo/ Replacement Site Built Mobile/ Manufactured homes: Owner occupied properties exceeding ability to rehabilitate may be replaced.

All programs are limited in funding.
